1. COLLABORATION BETWEEN SMA AND CFPS

In accordance with SMC's concern on contextual CME for non-specialists, the College of Family Physicians has launched an initiative with the two health clusters and the private sector to organise relevant and broad-based CME in association with the formal FMTP modular quarterly programme. As part of ongoing efforts to cooperate for the betterment of the medical profession, the SMA will be helping CFPS to circulate the quarterly Modular CME and Training programme in the monthly mailbag to SMA Members.

As it will not be possible to update records for the year 2001 after 31 December 2001, we would like to request that members submit their log sheets (available in the SMC Online CME System booklet) to the SMA Secretariat by 15 December 2001 at the latest. It is necessary to provide your userid and password to the SMA CME Coordinator to facilitate the updating of CME claims. Steps will be taken to ensure the confidentiality of passwords.

3. MANAGED CARE SUB-COMMITTEE

During the recent SMA Practice Management Seminar on "Surviving Managed Care", participants proposed an SMA standing Committee on Managed Care to update doctors and discuss professional and practice issues in the context of Managed Care schemes.
