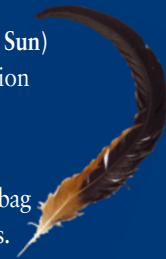

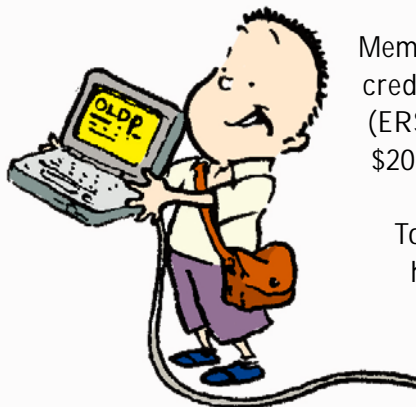


Donate @ a click

Interested to make a donation to charity from the comfort of your home? The Online Donation Portal (OLDP) is a first in Singapore for online donations to charitable organisations in Singapore. It is administered by the National Council of Social Service (NCSS).



The OLDP connects to all sectors such as the social services, health and medical, education, youth groups, community organisations and the arts. Charities and organisations which are Institutions of Public Character, essentially public institutions not operating for profit, can subscribe to the portal.



Members of the public have the option to make a donation via credit card or their allotted Economic Restructuring Shares (ERS). Donations, which are tax-deductible, can start from \$20. All donations will go directly to the charities.
