## **DEATH CERTIFICATION**

Medical certification is a privilege solely accorded to registered medical practitioners by the law. Certification of death carries significant responsibilities. The appropriate knowledge, skills and attitudes are necessary to fulfil this responsibility. Failure or neglect of this responsibility could lead to serious legal, ethical and professional repercussions. When called to do such certification of death, the practitioner must have reviewed the past and recent medical history, as well as the circumstances of death. The doctor needs to understand the difference between the cause, mechanism,



mode and manner of death. The doctor must discern and make appropriate clinical judgement as to the anatomical and pathological cause of death. Doctors must be aware of their responsibilities under the Coroners Act. The Coroners Act 2010 requires all doctors to be able to recognise when deaths need to be reported to the Coroner.

This workshop provides medical professionals with the basic knowledge and foundations in the execution of this important duty.
